So, how exactly did these cities become the cream of the crop, you might ask? Well, they were judged on the quality of their offerings, affordability and traveller satisfaction. Here are just five of the 10 winners who were given the top spots...

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CAIRNS, QLD

Ah, the sunny north! Tropical Cairns is the gateway to some of our most incredible natural wonders – the Great Barrier Reef and the Daintree National Park. See the city's amazing landscape from above on the Skyrail Rainforest Cableway and, once back on land, visit one of the many foodie spots, such as Italian restaurant L'unico Trattoria at Trinity Beach, Japanese noodle house Ganbaranba in the CBD or

head for a cocktail at Three Wolves bar (try The Idealist!). Also stay tuned for a brand new island opening in early 2022 – yes, island! Aussie adventure and leisure tourism company Experience Co. will be opening Cairns' first pontoon on the Great Barrier Reef, currently dubbed 'Dreamtime Island'. It's set to offer visitors science education on the water and reef that surrounds it, weaving in a narrative of Indigenous storytelling and eco-initiatives.

APOLLO BAY, VIC

Nestled along the Great Ocean Road, this "seafood village", as they've called themselves, is the ultimate spot for wildlife and wilderness lovers. Surrounded by seemingly never-ending stretches of sand and sea, plenty of walking trails and the Great Otway National Park, you'll never get bored during your visit. There's also a new walking adventure company that can help show you around the area. Wildlife Wonders guided walks have a conservationist join their treks to teach visitors about the unique wildlife, the stunning bushlands and the ecology of the Otway ranges. All profits from these guided walks are donated to The Conservation Ecology Centre (CEC).

MCLAREN VALE, SA

Wine regions are really having a moment this year. This gem, 40 minutes from Adelaide, offers everything from your classic wine tours to cheesemaking, wine blending and even a Shiraz trail you can bike around. But there's more to this region than just wineries. Opened in 2020, Never Never Distilling Co. is bringing a new layer to McLaren Vale. Launching as part of the Chalk Hill Collective, this hotspot offers a collaborative experience of food, wine and gin distilling – with Chalk Hill Wines Cellar Door and restaurant Cucina di Strada on the premises, too. Guests can enjoy gin and tonic flights, distillery tours and more. While there are plenty of accommodation options, off-grid tiny houses company Cabn just opened two new X cabins (Giles and William) in the Vale earlier this month. Bask in the coastal views through to Port Willunga, and enjoy Gemtree Wines and local produce for just \$595 a night.
